## **CaliforniaVolunteers Announces 2011-12 AmeriCorps Competitive Portfolio**

Grant funding to help AmeriCorps programs address critical needs at the community level

**SACRAMENTO, Calif.** – CaliforniaVolunteers announced today its 2011-12 AmeriCorps competitive portfolio, consisting of 25 AmeriCorps programs and supporting more than 1,700 members addressing critical education, environmental, economic opportunity, health or other human needs.

“AmeriCorps members and the programs they serve are an invaluable asset in tackling the increased challenges our communities face in California,” said Secretary of Service and Volunteering, Karen Baker. “At a time of national economic crisis, I am proud to say California has been successful in remaining competitive by securing funding to support our local communities who need it most.”

The 2011-12 California competitive AmeriCorps portfolio consists of programs funded through a national grant competition from the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS). Twenty-five California AmeriCorps programs were successful in the national competition, bringing in more than \$15.8 million in federal AmeriCorps funding to the state. CaliforniaVolunteers received an additional \$11.4 million from CNCS based upon the state’s population to fund additional programs through a grant review process. The formula grant awards to programs will be announced in July.

AmeriCorps is a national service program that engages Americans of all ages and background in service to meet critical needs in education, the environment, economic opportunity, health, and other areas. Its members serve in thousands of nonprofit and faith-based organizations in rural and urban communities throughout the nation. Among other activities, AmeriCorps members tutor and mentor youth, build affordable housing, teach computer skills, clean parks and streams, run after school programs, help communities respond to disasters, and recruit and train volunteers.
