The 2016 CERT 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary National Conference Award winners are as follows:

### **Outstanding Community Emergency Response Team Initiatives and/or Innovation - Irvine Police Department CERT, California**

Presented to the Irvine Police Department CERT, which created and implemented an initiative that improved the ability of their CERT program to achieve innovative and sustainable practices in emergency management to make their jurisdiction safer, stronger, better prepared, and more resilient.

### **Outstanding Inclusive Initiatives in Emergency Management - Office of Access and Functional Needs, California Governor's Office of Emergency Services**

Presented to the Office of Access and Functional Needs, California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, which has excelled in working with populations that are disproportionately impacted by disasters due to risks associated with access and functional needs in order to better prepare them for disasters.

### **Most Valuable CERT Volunteer - Trish Huelga, Ozark, Missouri**

Presented to Trish Huelga for her outstanding contribution to her CERT program and community.

**Outstanding Private Sector Initiatives - Nutrilite CERT, Buena Park, California**

Presented to Nutrilite CERT, which has demonstrated outstanding creativity and made a measurable impact in engaging employees and local communities in improving disaster preparedness and resilience.

**Preparing the Whole Community - City of Issaquah CERT Program, Issaquah, Washington**

Presented to the City of Issaquah CERT Program, which successfully engaged their community to improve disaster preparedness and resilience; encouraged and explored ways to develop whole community partnerships; and advocated a grassroots approach to emergency planning.

**Private Sector Award – NBCUniversal, Hollywood, California**

Presented to NBCUniversal for going above and beyond within the private sector to grow and promote a CERT program.

**Lifetime Achievement Award – Frank Borden, Los Angeles, California**

Presented to Frank Borden, also known as the “Father of CERT,” for his lifetime commitment to CERT.
