"Many heat related deaths and illnesses can be prevented by simple activities such as knocking on your neighbors door to make sure they have enough water or checking to see if they have a means to stay cool."

Attendees included representatives from various state and local agencies including John Anderson, coastal region administrator for the governor's Office of Emergency Services and Kim Shunk, director office of emergency services, city of San Jose.
